Installation

Physical Installation:

- 1. Connect an Ethernet network cable to the LAN port of the ATA.
- 2. Plug the analogue telephone into the FXS port of the ATA. In the UK please use the supplied BT-to-RJ11 adaptor, even if you are using a DECT phone which has an RJ11 cable with it.
- 3. Plug an RJ11 cable into the FXO port on the ATA & plug the other end into the telephone jack on the wall. In the UK please use the supplied RJ11-to-BT adaptor.
- 4. Plug in the power lead & turn on the power. Only use the supplied power adaptor.
- 5. Confirm that the status LED (A) starts blinking which shows the unit is booting up. After this LED (D) should blink showing network connectivity.

Configuration:

Under normal circumstances the ATA unit will be delivered pre-configured & ready to use. Once the physical installation has been carried out as above you should be ready to start placing & receiving calls using both VoIP & your existing PSTN line.

In order to manually configure the device you will need the following information from your VoIP Service Provider:

- User Name/ID.
- Password.
- Proxy Server name/IP address.

They may also provide you with any of the following settings:

- Outbound Proxy name/IP address.
- STUN Server name/IP address.
- Authentication User name (often the same as User Name/ID).

The usual method of configuration is using a web interface. Most networks will have DHCP enabled so the unit will automatically obtain an IP address. Use the handset configuration table below to find the IP address & type this into a web browser on your network to access the web interface.

Enter in the user name, password & proxy server name/IP address.

If using an outbound proxy:

- Set "Use Outbound Proxy" to "yes".
- Set "Outbound Proxy" to the name or IP address supplied by your VoIP provider.

If using a STUN server:

- Set "NAT Mapping Enable"to "yes".
- Set "NAT Keep Alive Enable"to "yes".
- Set "Substitute VIA addr" to "yes".
- Set "STUN Enable" to "yes".
- Set "STUN Server" to the name or IP address supplied by your VoIP provider.

It is also possible to carry out basic configuration using an analogue telephone plugged into the FXS port.

Lift the handset & dial **00 to access the menu. After entering an option, press the hash (#) key to proceed.

The following table shows how to use the handset configuration. Normally this is just used to either find out an automatically set IP address (when using DHCP) or to configure IP information when not using DHCP.
